

Immigration is at the heart of the American story.

The rich cultural diversity and open society that defines the United States has promoted creativity, innovation, and economic growth throughout our history. The Bible makes it clear that God has a heart for immigrants, refugees, resident aliens, and strangers. Without current events, immigration is the center of much debate. THE SURPASSING GRACE

The word "surpass" means to exceed, to go beyond, to transcend the reach or capacity of. In his second letter to the church at Corinth, St. Paul refers to "the surpassing grace of God that he has given you" (2 Corinthians 9:14, NRSV). Paul was reminding the Corinthians of the amazing, abundant grace God had showered upon them.

When Paul wrote that letter, the church in Jerusalem was suffering intense persecution. The members were poor and struggling to be faithful under dire circumstances.

Paul knew the church at Corinth was doing fine financially and that they had a mind to help out the Jerusalem church. He wrote: "You glorify God ... by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, while they ... pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you" (2 Corinthians 9:13-14, NRSV).



HOME WINTERIZATION: ACT OF CREATION CARE, WALLET CARE, AND COMFORT CARE

This article is not a complete guide to winterization. It is intended to remind us that winter is nearly here and there is still time to improve our homes' readiness. Much of the article is based on: https://handymanhub.com/wp-content/uploads/2017/10/Winterization-1.pdf

Winterizing your house isn't only about staying warm. A house that isn't winterized will consume more energy and costs continue to rise every year. But it's not just about costs, it's about creation care. Any energy source that uses fossil fuels (coal, oil, natural gas, propane) for electricity and heat generation degrades God's creation. The CO2 and other contaminant emissions change the earth's climate and degrade the environment. Failing to winterize will cost you more money on top of repair headaches. Save more, worry less, and stay comfortable by checking your home and performing tasks to ensure it is winter-ready.

The website will walk you through a set of improvements for your home.

- Furnaces, ductwork, and thermostats
- Insulation in attic and walls, as well as around water heaters
- Ceiling fans
- Fireplaces, wood stoves, and chimneys
- House exterior
- Windows and doors
- Locating sources of drafts
- Checking outside faucets and hoses and insulating water pipes

You can easily perform many weatherproofing jobs yourself depending on the specific type of winterization. The work may require little investment beyond your time and a few basic supplies. Even the cost of additional insulation pays off every time you open your utility bills! The costs are also paid off by the decreased harm done to creation!

The Green Team's purpose is to "raise awareness of and advocate for the care of creation." Our mission is to support and encourage creation care ministries, raise awareness, model creation care advocacy consistent with ELCA teachings in our faith communities and public life.
