The table beds are back in our parking lot (in a different spot due to the construction vehicles). The individual planters are now available for you to “adopt”. We welcome and encourage gardeners who want to plant and care for their planters at the church. As we did last year, you may take one of the containers home and care for it this summer (and return this fall).



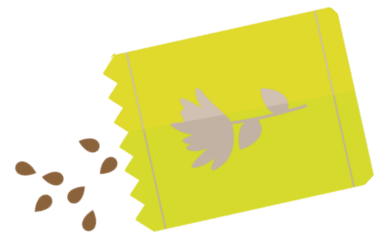
Here are some important things to remember:

1. Sign up for a planter(s) in the church office.
2. Remember that YOU are responsible for its care, including watering.
3. BE CAREFUL when you pull out the water hose, as there is construction going on in that area. Always return the hose to its holder and make sure the water is turned off.
4. Place a labelled wooden stick in your planter, with your name or group (office has the sticks for you).

Things you might want to plant:

Tomatoes, peppers, herbs, kale, lettuce, broccoli, flowers

Root veggies that don't need a lot of depth or staking



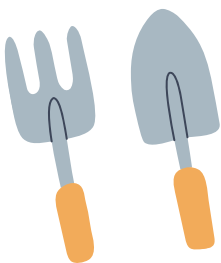

Other notes:

The soil in each container is a better mixture than what we used last year (we learned from our mistakes).

Some gardening tools are in the planters for your use. Please leave them for others. A plastic bag dispenser is also provided, so that you can place your produce in a bag to take home.

The traditional church herb garden is in its regular place, but is a bit smaller. (We are experimenting this year!) It is for everyone to enjoy!
