***PRAYER OF THE DAY**

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

FIRST LESSON: Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32

Ezekiel challenges those who think they cannot change because of what their parents were and did, or who think they cannot reverse their own previous behavior. God insistently invites people to turn and live.

¹ The word of the Lord came to me: ² What do you mean by repeating this proverb concerning the land of Israel, “The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children’s teeth are set on edge”?

³ As I live, says the Lord God, this proverb shall no more be used by you in Israel. ⁴ Know that all lives are mine; the life of the parent as well as the life of the child is mine: it is only the person who sins who shall die.

²⁵ Yet you say, “The way of the Lord is unfair.” Hear now, O house of Israel: Is my way unfair? Is it not your ways that are unfair? ²⁶ When the righteous turn away from their righteousness and commit iniquity, they shall die for it; for the iniquity that they have committed, they shall die. ²⁷ Again, when the wicked turn away from the wickedness they have committed and do what is lawful and right, they shall save their life. ²⁸ Because they considered and turned away from all the transgressions that they had committed, they shall surely live; they shall not die. ²⁹ Yet the house of Israel says, “The way of the Lord is unfair.” O house of Israel, are my ways unfair? Is it not your ways that are unfair?

³⁰ Therefore I will judge you, O house of Israel, all of you according to your ways, says the Lord God. Repent and turn from all your transgressions; otherwise iniquity will be your ruin.

³¹ Cast away from you all the transgressions that you have committed against me, and get yourselves a new heart and a new spirit! Why will you die, O house of Israel? ³² For I have no pleasure in the death of anyone, says the Lord God. Turn, then, and live.

SECOND LESSON: Philippians 2:1-13

Paul writes to the Philippians from prison. Though he is uncertain about the outcome of his imprisonment, he is committed to the ministry of the gospel and calls on the Philippians to live lives that reflect and enhance the gospel mission.

- ¹If, then, there is any comfort in Christ, any consolation from love, any partnership in the Spirit, any tender affection and sympathy, ²make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. ⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,
- ⁶who, though he existed in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God
as something to be grasped,
- ⁷but emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
assuming human likeness.
- And being found in appearance as a human,
⁸he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross.

⁹ Therefore God exalted him even more highly

and gave him the name

that is above every other name,

¹⁰ so that at the name given to Jesus

every knee should bend,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

***GOSPEL LESSON: Matthew 21:23-32**

After driving the moneychangers out of the temple (21:12), Jesus begins teaching there. His authority is questioned by the religious leaders, who are supposed to be in charge of the temple.

²³ When [Jesus] entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching and said, “By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?” ²⁴ Jesus said to them, “I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵ Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?” And they argued with one another, “If we say, ‘From heaven,’ he will say to us, ‘Why, then, did you not believe him?’ ²⁶ But if we say, ‘Of human origin,’ we are afraid of the crowd, for all regard John as a prophet.” ²⁷ So they answered Jesus, “We do not know.” And he said to them, “Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

²⁸ “What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, ‘Son, go and work in the vineyard today.’ ²⁹ He answered, ‘I will not,’ but later he changed his mind and went.

³⁰ The father went to the second and said the same, and he answered, ‘I go, sir,’ but he did not go.

³¹ Which of the two did the will of his father?” They said, “The first.” Jesus said to them, “Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you.

³² For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him, and even after you saw it you did not change your minds and believe him.”

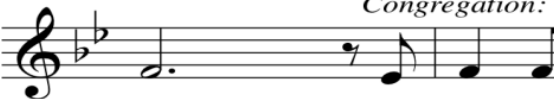

We welcome Pastor Tom Pierotti to our pulpit today. We thank him for preaching today, as well as directing our pastoral leadership while Pastor Jeff and Kari have had their renewal time. This is the final week of Pastor Jeff's leave.

Pastor Pierotti graduated from Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg in 1976 and recently was honored with the 50th celebration of his ordination. His first call was to Zion's Lutheran Church in Greensburg, PA. While there, he pursued a Master of Sacred Theology degree in Advanced Pastoral Care from the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. That led to several years of non-parish ministry, first as Director/Developer of the Warren Pastoral Counseling Center and later as Vice President of Lutheran Social Services of New England. He returned to parish ministry in Butler, PA in 1998. Through his interest in politics, he developed "Citizenship and Discipleship", a confirmation program which involved helping students to understand the relationship between faith and politics. This always included a trip to Washington, DC and interviews with our US Senators and Congressmen, worship at the National Cathedral, and a visit to the Gettysburg Seminary.

Tom is married to Lynn (Hodas) Pierotti, a lifetime member of First Lutheran Church. He has four adult children, all of whom have their own careers and live within a one days' drive. He loves gardening, woodworking, being in the woods or on a golf course. Pastor is also very much involved with our local refugee and resettlement group, WARRN (Warren Area Refugee and Resettlement Network).

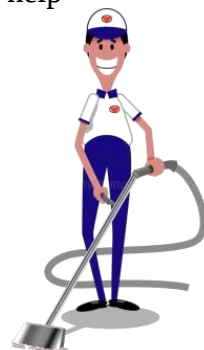

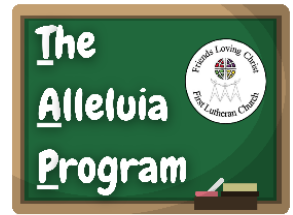


WARREN'S ITALIAN HERITAGE
